



Contributors

Myles Dungan holds a PhD in History from Trinity College, Dublin. He is the presenter of The History Show on RTÉ Radio 1 and has authored many books on 19th century Irish history and the Great War. Twice a Fulbright scholar, he is also Programme Director of the Hinterland Festival.

David McCullagh is a broadcaster with a PhD in politics from University College Dublin. He is the author of four books on Irish history. He is best known for his formidable two-volume reassessment of Eamon de Valera — as a leader of the Easter Rising, figurehead of the anti-treaty rebels during the Civil War and later, founder of Fianna Fáil and President of Ireland.

Flor MacCarthy is a journalist and author. Her bestselling book, The Presidents' Letters, was shortlisted for Best Irish Published Book 2021. She presents political debates on Oireachtas TV from Leinster House and the European Parliament and is a former news reporter and television presenter with RTÉ.

Paul Minihan is a native of Corofin and a member of the Mid Clare Brigade Commemoration Committee. Paul's grandfather John Minihan served as an Officer of the Mid Clare Brigade during the War of Independence and was Divisional Quartermaster of the 1st Western Division of the IRA during the Civil War.

Joe Ó Muircheartaigh is a journalist and historian. His current documentary *Gael Force – Shots that Split Clare GAA* explores the origins of the GAA split that occurred 100 years ago at the height of the Civil War when Gaelic Games became split along Civil War lines.

Martin Walsh holds a PhD in History from the University of Limerick. Martin currently works as a Project Officer with the University of Limerick Oral History Project.

Ida Milne holds a PhD from Trinity College on the social, political and medical impact of the 1918-19 influenza pandemic. She has taught history in TCD, Maynooth University, Queen's University and DCU. She currently lectures at Carlow College. Her other research interests include the social history of Protestants in the Republic, the newspaper industry and Wicklow in the Decade of Centenaries.

Peter McGarry is a Limerick based documentary filmmaker whose previous work includes Cleared for Disaster, based on major air crashes at Shannon Airport from 1946-1961. His love of aviation began at a young age when he worked with aircraft trading and leasing.

Cuimhneamh an Chláir / Clare Memories was founded in 2009 with the aim of recording the people and stories of an older time in Co Clare and safeguarding those stories in a publicly available archive.

Kirsten Mulrennan is the Archivist for Engagement, Exhibition and Outreach Office in the Special Collections & Archives Department of the University of Limerick. She is responsible for faculty and student engagement with primary sources.

Críostóir Mac Cárthaigh is a former Director of the National Folklore Collection at UCD. He has written extensively on aspects of Irish oral literature, oral history, vernacular architecture, traditional boats and fishing. His PhD dealt with the subject of storytelling in fishing communities in Corca Dhuibhne, Kerry.

Deirdre Ní Chongaile is a writer, musician, broadcaster and curator from the Aran Islands. Working bilingually across multiple disciplines, she is drawn to voices, contemporary and historical. Deirdre curates the exhibition on Prof. Tomás Ó Máille who was the first professor of Irish at the University of Galway from 1909-1938.
